Hurt is an award-winning documentary filmmaker, published writer, anti-sexist activist, and lecturer. His most popular documentary to date is *Hip-Hop: Beyond Beats and Rhymes*. He is a founding member of the Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP) program, the leading college-based rape and domestic violence prevention initiative for college and professional athletics.
