successful and smooth application process.



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APPL

Stay organized, know your deadlines and get all of your application materials together. For each school/program you will need:

- Resume or CV - Transcripts from all institutions
- Testing scores
- Letters of recommendationPersonal Statement

Make sure you give yourself enough time to compile materials! Remember to factor in waiting and transit times.

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Once you receive admissions decisions, evaluate your options. Have you been accepted, wait listed or denied admittance? What do the funding opportunities look like? Weigh out the pros and cons of attending each school.

Rank schools according to categories of importance. Take some time to reflect on where you want to spend the

next 2-5 years.

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You will need to respond by accepting or declining the offer to most institutions by mid Spring.

Treat your decision as a contractual agreement, when you accept
