The Arc of Volusia was chartered by the State of Florida on March 23, 1962 and serves approximately 250 Volusia County adults with developmental disabilities. The DeLand and Daytona Beach training centers each serve about 100 individuals and feature Adult Day Training Level I, a self-help skill acquisition program for individuals with intense needs, Adult Day Training Level II, which includes work skill development and sheltered workshop programs, and Community Inclusion, a small group community participation program. Additionally, the Supported Employment and Supported Living programs emphasize individuals integrating into the community at competitive job sites and in their own homes serve a combined fifty participants.
