Stetson University Hosts Templeton Business Ethics Case Competition *20 schools from across the country participated*

DELAND, Florida, Feb. 26, 2019 – Wake Forest students took the top spot in the annual Templeton Business Ethics Case Competition held at Stetson University Feb. 21-22. Pennsylvania State University took second place, Clemson University placed third and Elon University secured fourth. The top four teams received cash prizes and trophies. As host of the competition, Stetson did not compete.

“We started hosting this competition five years ago because we saw a rising interest in co-curricular programming that gives students relevant, practical experience in solving business ethical and legal dilemmas. Over the years our cases have ranged across several areas of business activity from employee rights issues to environmental issues to this year’s gender equity case,” explained Jim Beasley, Ph.D., professor of management and co-director of the event. “Teaching students how to deal with these complex ethical issues in business is the primary mission of hosting such an event as the Templeton.”

Undergraduate students from 20 invited institutions across the country had the opportunity to analyze and present arguments on a contemporary business issue tied to financial, legal and ethical issues. In addition to the four teams mentioned above, other participants this year included:

After receiving the case, teams were given two weeks to prepare and submit an executive summary and a visual presentation. During the event, teams made an oral presentation to a panel of judges. Bracket winners then delivered a final eight-minute oral presentation to the entire body of judges in a plenary session including all conference attendees, members of the Stetson University community and the public.
