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About Stetson University

Beginnings

New York entrepreneur Henry A. DeLand, who played a leading role in establishing the city of DeLand in 1876, founded the university as DeLand Academy. Thirteen students started classes in a rented building in 1883. The following year, Mr. DeLand erected a building at the corner of Woodland Boulevard and Minnesota Avenue to house classrooms and administrative offices. That building, now known as DeLand Hall, is the oldest building in Florida to be used continuously for higher education. After experiencing financial difficulties in the late 1880s, Mr. DeLand found it impossible to support the university. He turned to Philadelphia hatmaker John Batterson Stetson, who had recently built a winter home in DeLand. Mr. Stetson provided much-needed funding for the new institution, and in 1887, John B. Stetson was elected to the university's Board of Trustees. In 1889 the institution was renamed in his honor.

Degrees & Control

Stetson is an independent, private university, controlled by a Board of Trustees. Stetson is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's and master's degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Business Administration; bachelor's degrees in the School of Music; and Juris Doctor, Master of Jurisprudence and Master of Laws degrees in the College of Law. The DeLand, Florida, campus houses the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Music and the School of Business Administration. The College of Law is located in Gulfport, Florida, with a satellite campus in Tampa.







Undergraduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity







National Student Clearinghouse Completion Rates


Tables below show total six-year college completion rates for <u>National Student Clearinghouse</u> (NSC) FTIC cohorts, through May 31st of the sixth academic year, including completion rates for students who graduated from Stetson and for those who completed their degrees at another institution. These data are based on reports from the NSC, which tracks 96 percent of college enrollments nationwide.

Important note on methodology: National Student Clearinghouse cohort definitions differ from federal cohort definitions used in typical graduation rate reporting. 
