




Average Undergraduate Class Size - Fall 2014



Degrees Awarded July 2013 - June 2014





Top undergraduate majors of students graduating in July 2013 - June 2014



Student Demographics


Undergraduate Enrollment by Ethnicity from Fall 2008-2014













CPA Exam Passage Rates





A Look Back

New York entrepreneur Henry A. DeLand, who played a leading role in establishing the city of DeLand in 1876, founded the university as DeLand Academy. Thirteen students started classes in a rented building in 1883. The following year, Mr. DeLand erected a building at the corner of Woodland Boulevard and Minnesota Avenue to house classrooms and administrative offices. That building, now known as DeLand Hall, is the oldest building in Florida to be used continuously for higher education. After experiencing financial difficulties in the late 1880s, Mr. DeLand found it impossible to support the university. He turned to Philadelphia hatmaker John Batterson Stetson, who had recently built a winter home in DeLand. Mr. Stetson provided much-needed funding for the new institution, and in 1887, John B. Stetson was elected to the university's Board of Trustees. In 1889 the institution was renamed in his honor.

Degrees & Control

Stetson is an independent, private university, controlled by a Board of Trustees. Stetson is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award the Bachelor's and Master's degrees in the College of Arts & Sciences and School of Business Administration; Bachelor's degrees in the School of Music; and Juris Doctor and Master of Laws degrees in the College of Law. The DeLand campus houses the College of Arts & Sciences, School of Music and the School of Business Administration. The College of Law is located in Gulfport, with a satellite campus in Tampa. The Stetson University Center is located in Celebration, Florida.
