## INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the 2024-25 Stetson University Fact Book.

The Fact Book is a compilation of commonly requested data and statistical information about Stetson University, including its student and employee populations. It includes information about institutional measures such as enrollment, retention, graduation, and degrees conferred. Additional information will be added to the document throughout the year as it becomes available.

Institutional Research and Effectiveness produces this publication in an effort to provide reliable and accurate information to the Stetson community. We extend our appreciation to all of the University offices that assisted us with the collection and development of this information.

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### Beginnings

New York entrepreneur Henry A. DeLand, who played a leading role in establishing the city of DeLand in 1876, founded the university as DeLand Academy. Thirteen students started classes in a rented building in 1883. The following year, Mr. DeLand erected a building at the corner of Woodland Boulevard and Minnesota Avenue to house classrooms and administrative offices. That building, now known as DeLand Hall, is the oldest building in Florida to be used continuously for higher education. After experiencing financial difficulties in the late 1880s, Mr. DeLand found it impossible to support the university. He turned to Philadelphia hatmaker John Batterson Stetson, who had recently built a winter home in DeLand. Mr. Stetson provided much-needed funding for the new institution, and in 1887, John B. Stetson was elected to the university's Board of Trustees. In 1889 the institution was renamed in his honor.

### University Accreditation

Stetson is an independent university, controlled by a self-elected Board of Trustees. Stetson University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to award baccalaureate, masters, education specialist and doctorate degrees. Stetson University also may offer credentials such as certificates and diplomas at approved degree levels. ### NATIONAL STUDENT CLEARINGHOUSE COMPLETION RATES

Tables below show total six-year college completion rates for National Student Clearinghouse FTIC cohorts, through June 30th of the sixth academic year, including completion rates for students who graduated from Stetson and for those who completed their degrees at another institution. These data are based on reports from the NSC, which tracks 97 percent of college enrollments nationwide.

Important note on methodology: National Student Clearinghouse cohort definitions differ from federal cohort definitions used in typical graduation rate reporting. National Student Clearinghouse cohorts include first-time degree-seeking students, of any age, who began their postsecondary studies in the fall term of the cohort year, and in an effort to exclude current dual enrollment students, exclude students who have prior enrollment records or degree conferral records after their 18th birthday or who were 17 years old or younger during the fall term of the cohort year.

## MULTI-YEAR ACADEMIC PROGRESS RATE

**Academic Progress Rate (APR)** holds institutions accountable for the academic progress of their student-athletes through a team-based metric that accounts for the eligibility and retention of each student-athlete for each academic term. The APR is calculated as follows: Each student-athlete receiving athletically related financial aid earns one point for staying in school and one point for being academically eligible. A team's total points are divided by points possible and then multiplied by 1,000 to equal the team's Academic Progress Rate. Teams must earn a four-year average APR of 930 to compete in championships.

## GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

**Graduation Success Rate (GSR)** The student-athlete graduation rate calculated directly based on the IPEDS-Graduation Rates Survey (which is the methodology the U.S. Department of Education requires) is the proportion of first-year, full-time student-athletes who entered a school on athletics aid and graduated from that institution within six years. The NCAA GSR differs from the federal calculation in two important ways. First, the GSR holds colleges accountable for those student-athletes who transfer into their school. Second, the GSR does not penalize colleges whose student-athletes transfer in good academic standing.
