Take- aways from SACSCOC Meeting (Dec '19)

- . Student learning is the focus, not faculty/staff activity
- . Choice of topic must be supported with assessment data
- . Plan and implement a five-year "regroup" opportunity
- . Keep the fifth year impact report in mind
- . Make sure your QEP fits your institution
- Make sure the choice is something we can all agree needs work (even if it isn't your own favorite idea)

Take- away from SACSCOC Meeting

- . What should we ALREADY be doing? Then, do that.
- Develop specific statements about what students should learn as a result of QEP investment; use for assessment (5 year report)
- Scope is probably the greatest challenge for the institution. Many overestimate what they can accomplish.
- . Study previous QEP documents to learn what to do better

Considerations in QEP Topic Selection

- Capability: Does the institution have the capacity to implement, sustain, and complete the QEP?
- Involvement: Will the institution be able to ensure ongoing involvement of all essential constituents to successfully complete the QEP?
- Assessment Plan: Will the institution be able to ensure that measurement of student learning/success can be documented throughout and at the conclusion of the QEP?

Movement Forward: Integrative Learning

- We've talked about Experiential Learning, Student engaged research, High Impact Practices; Advising, Coaching, Mentoring; ePortfolio. And more.
- Starting to lean toward:
 - Articulating Integrative Learning: reflection, integration, critical/intellectual skills (including Q and S)
 - Plan: present two choices to the community
