Kelly B. Smith - Assistant Professor of Political Science







Project Highlights

Gubernatorial Race

• While the margin of victory was higher than we polled, **CPOR was correct in predicting the outcome of the election.**







Halloween Poll

- Our poll found that 60% of registered Florida voters are at least "a little worried" about illegal drugs being disguised in candy
 - 15% of Democrats and 18% of Republicans being "very worried."
- peanut butter cups are the most popular Halloween candy
 - followed by Kit Kats, M&Ms, Snickers, and Kisses, while Gummy Bears, Candy Corn, Twizzlers, Tootsie Rolls, and Licorice are the least liked.

Alumni Poll

- Our survey with student callers focused on Stetson alumni's satisfaction with their degrees and current job.
- It served two main purposes:
 - Training our student workers in survey administration
 - Strengthening our relations with Stetson alumni.



Project Highlights Cont.

Omnibus Survey

- A recently completed project is a large-N omnibus survey, which covers a wide range of topics.
 - Including: critical race theory, the use of AI in government, opinions on labgrown meat, and many other pressing topics.
- Designed to help political science seniors at Stetson complete their research project required for graduation.
- We plan to release a series of press releases and reports highlighting our findings and insights.









Sunrail Survey

- We are currently conducting another survey that started on November 9, 2022, and is still ongoing.
- This survey focuses on attitudes toward Central Florida's public transportation operations and aims to gather data on how residents view the current transportation infrastructure and services in the region.
- This survey is also unique in that it is jointly being used to create our own participant panel, which will be used to give future surveys to.

Where do you stand? Stetson students work polls at new Center for Public Opinion Research




On December 1st, 2022, the Daytona Beach News-Journal published an article on the opening of Stetson's Center for Public Opinion Research (CPOR). The article further showcases the center's commitment to providing students with valuable, hands-on experience in the field of survey research and politics.

It also **highlights the center's nonpartisan approach** and its focus on collaboration and inclusion, as it welcomes students from different majors and disciplines to participate in the organization's operations. The article's coverage of CPOR's recent polls also helps to promote the center's work and raise its profile among the public.

One of our recent polls conducted by the **CPOR was also referenced on the non-partisan political statistics website**, **FiveThirtyEight**. The poll focused on the 2022 gubernatorial and Senate races. CPOR is striving to achieve high ratings on the website to assure those who view the works of our ability to provide accurate and transparent data.

We are proud of our team's hard work and dedication to producing accurate and insightful polling data that is recognized by reputable organizations such as FiveThirtyEight. Currently, Stetson's CPOR has a "provisional grade" which is always a B/C on 538. (We have correctly called 100% of our races!) This provisional grade will be replaced with an actual grade when we publish at least 10 qualifying polls (i.e., polls published within 21 days of the election).



Future Projects



Orlando Economic Partnership

One of the first organizations to contract CPOR after its initial launch was the Orlando Economic Partnership (OEP). We are currently negotiating an annual contract that will survey OEP membership businesses and business leaders about their opinions and concerns surrounding Orlando's economy. In addition, CPOR will be creating an Orlando Consumer Panel, comprised of thousands of Orlando-area residents. This panel will allow for fast, "flash polls" to get instant feedback from the Orlando-area community.

Community Education Project

Our organization has partnered with the Community Education Program (CEP) and Dr. Melinda Hall to conduct a collaborative survey on prison reentry into society. The aim of the survey is to identify the challenges faced by ex-offenders in reintegrating into their communities and explore potential solutions to these issues. As a neutral research facility, we strive to conduct unbiased research that can improve the lives of people in our community.

By partnering with SMART Lab, we hope to develop evidence-based stress-management interventions that can be implemented at a community level.
