

Residency Checklist January 1-11, 2020 Atlantic Center for the Arts

- If you are flying, there are two options for airports: Daytona Beach (which is smaller and closer only thirty minutes away from ACA, yet usually more expensive) or Orlando (which is generally cheaper and just over an hour away).
- You need to arrange your own travel to ACA, including to and from airports.

- Check in at the ACA is on January 1<sup>st</sup>, anytime between 1pm to 5pm. You cannot check in earlier.
- Departure is the morning of the 11<sup>th</sup>. The last event for the residency is the student reading on the evening of January 10<sup>th</sup>. Yes: this reading is required for all students. Time: generally 3-4 minutes. Some bring prepared work; others read something they made during the residency. We love both options!

  - During the residency we have our own little MFA library from which students can check out books. These books must be returned by the end of the residency. Stetson is working to expand their resources and are preparing to order more books catered to our program.

We encourage you to start exploring their creative work; we are also sending a list of suggested encounters (including faculty works) to engage with before the residency.
