Students must graduate with a minimum overall GPA of 2.4 or above, and not be subject to the further required curriculum. Students with a final GPA below 2.4 or, who are subject to the further required curriculum, may apply to the joint JD/LL.M. program, but may only be admitted by exception. Limited exceptions will be granted.

Decisions for admission will consider all information contained within the application and accompanying materials.
