#### **NOTES:**

 Graduates are asked to report to campus on time in full regalia at their designated time listed above as we must take roll and verify name pronunciations prior to lining up for the procession. Graduates don tams, gowns, and hoods for the processional.

- Graduates' names, cords and honors tassels will be placed at their seat in their respective classroom staging area prior to the processional.
- Graduates are encouraged to leave personal items with their guests (such as wallets, bags, keys, cellphones). If a graduate needs to leave a personal item in the classroom staging area, they do so at their own risk.
- Guests will not be admitted to the classroom staging areas.
- Graduates' names will be placed at their seat in the reserved section under the graduate tent in the Plaza Mayor Courtyard. Graduate seating is located directly to the right of the stage.

## **COVID Screening and Safety Protocol:**

- Masks must be worn by graduates, their guests, faculty and staff. The only time
  a mask can be removed is after the graduate crosses the stage and pauses for a
  professional photograph taken by the Suites. Masks must immediately be put
  back on after the professional photograph.
  - Health screening will be conducted by the College of Law for everyone prior to their entrance into the campus proper.
    - Graduating students and current faculty and staff are asked to use the Everbridge app to complete their screening to streamline the

- process. Please show your screen at the check-in station.
- The check-in station for graduates will be in the Crummer Breezeway sidewalk by Classroom A.
- The check-in stations for guests will be outside the Student Center entrance on the southwest corner of campus and the Horseshoe by the Eleazer Courtroom.
- The check-in procedure will require a no-contact temperature check and answering a short questionnaire.
- The ceremony will be livestreamed for anyone not able to attend the ceremony in person.

### **FINAL REMINDERS:**

- Please be advised that your gowns are black. It is suggested that graduates
  wear dark or black shoes to the ceremony. If you are not wearing dark
  shoes, you may wish to bring a pair to change into for the ceremony.
- What should I wear under my robe for Commencement? Traditionally, dress shirts, slacks, skirts or dresses are worn under the robe with dress shoes. Graduates should wear sensible shoes for climbing stairs, walking in grassy areas and standing for extended periods of time. Your attire should reflect the auspicious nature of the occasion.
- Grad Images will take pictures of each graduate as they walk across the stage and again behind the staging area. Grad Images will contact graduates individually via email in regard to purchasing their photographs.
- Following the ceremony, all graduates are asked to return to their respective classrooms to retrieve any personal items and exit campus with their guests. Please ask your guests to stay in the Plaza Mayor Courtyard until the recession is complete and then meet you in the horseshoe to exit campus. Guests will not be admitted to the classroom staging areas. We ask everyone to please exit the Plaza Mayor Courtyard shortly after the recession in order for the College of Law to set-up for the next ceremony.
