



Student Health Insurance

- A. On-campus Degree Students:** All students enrolled at Stetson University College of Law — other than those enrolled exclusively in online programs — are required to have adequate domestic health insurance coverage during all periods of active enrollment.
- 1. Affected students:** This policy applies to the following students:
 - a. International students who hold F or J visas;
 - b. Students enrolled in any of the following programs:
 - (i) Full-time J.D. or J.D. dual-degree program;
 - (ii) Part-time J.D. or J.D. dual-degree program;
 - (iii) LL.M. in International Law;
 - (iv) Visiting or transient students; or
 - (iv) Any Stetson Law sponsored study-abroad program (see Section B).
 - 2. Enrollment in plan:** For students that do not have adequate health coverage, a Student Health Plan is available to all students through United Healthcare StudentResources. You can access the enrollment at the First Student website: www.firststudent.com and select ‘Stetson Law-Gulfport/Tampa’ in the drop down menu and click the **Enroll Now** link and download the form.
 - 3. Payment:** Students enrolled in the Student Health Plan will make payment to the Business Office or have it paid from their Financial Aid. Annual coverage typically will be charged in two equal installments (fall and spring). If a December graduate desires annual coverage, at the beginning of his or her final semester, the student must elect and pay for full annual coverage. Under certain other limited exceptions, a student may be permitted to select a per-semester charge; these exceptions include when a student will not be actively enrolled for the entire calendar year of coverage, when a student is absent from campus due to an approved leave of absence, and when a student will be attending the Autumn in London program or a year-long foreign exchange program and thus have international insurance associated with that study-abroad program.

B. Study-Abroad Programs: Students enrolled in Stetson Law study-abroad programs — including exchange and dual-degree programs at foreign institutions — are required to have international health insurance covering the period abroad. The insurance is arranged through the Office of International Programs and is automatically billed to the student's account.
