### **General Overview**

The Stetson University Choral Festival offers advanced instruction in choral performance and vocal expression for thriving musicians in grades 9-12. All participating students will prepare and perform exceptional choral literature with [Dr. Ryan Person](#), Director of Choral Activities, and [Dr. Pingyi Song](#), Associate Director of Choral Activities. ### **Registration**

Each director may [register](#) as many balanced SATB quartets as they wish by **Wednesday, September 16**. This event is intended for students interested in preparing and refining advanced choral music. With this said, each school's finest musicians will have the most fulfilling experience and are strongly encouraged to participate. The per student registration fee is \$30, which includes instruction and Friday lunch and dinner for participating students and up to two directors or chaperones per school.

### **Payment**

***NEW THIS YEAR! All sheet music will be purchased by the high school director immediately following registration. Sheet music will not be mailed from Stetson to each school. To accommodate this change, we have lowered last year's per student registration fee. As always, please understand that each selected musician must arrive at the festival having adequately internalized all pitches and rhythms in advance. Photocopying or sharing music between students is prohibited, and Stetson will not have extra music to provide at the festival.***

### **Voice Lessons**

Interested upperclassman students may be selected to experience a 30-minute private voice lesson with a Stetson voice faculty member. Interest may be expressed upon registration, and preference will be given to approximately 35 high school musicians. The lesson will include vocal and performance technique. Though not required, each lesson student may also choose to perform a prepared solo selection for their instructor. During this experience, they may be selected to sing their solo at the final Saturday evening Festival Concert. If selected, a collaborative pianist will be

provided. All voice lessons will take place in Presser Hall, and a schedule will be available prior to the festival.

### **Concert Attire**

All students should perform in all black concert performance attire. This may include black garments that are used for your high school performances or other formal black options.

### **Performance Overview**

Two concerts will take place during the festival, with the first held on Friday evening at 6 p.m. in Lee Chapel. This event will feature special performances by the Stetson Chorale, Hatter Choir, and Stetson Opera Theatre. The Saturday evening concert will conclude the festival with performances by the Stetson University Concert Choir and High School Festival Choir beginning at 7 p.m. The public is welcome to attend both performances without tickets and free of charge

### **Festival Check-in**

Festival check-in will be held on Friday, October 2, from 9:00-9:45 a.m. Directors and students may check in at the registration table located inside the main east entrance to Presser Hall (419 N. Woodland Blvd, DeLand). Presser Hall is situated in the northeast corner of Woodland Blvd. and East Michigan Ave. At registration, each student and director(s) will be provided with a name badge.

### **Facilities and Parking**

All rehearsals on Friday and Saturday morning will be held in Lee Chapel of Elizabeth Hall. Saturday afternoon's rehearsals will be held in a location to be determined. Here is a [campus map](#) to assist. Also, here is more information about the [city of DeLand](#).

## **Meals & Campus Free Time**

Students and up to two directors/chaperones per represented school may eat two meals on campus on Friday – lunch in the Carlton Union Building (CUB) Dining Hall and a pizza dinner in Palm Court. Meal options in the Dining Hall support those with food allergies, intolerances, or vegetarian/vegan needs. On Saturday, all students and directors will be responsible for eating lunch and dinner on their own. Students are also encouraged to visit the Stetson Bookstore in the CUB on Friday between 8 a.m and 4 p.m.

## **Lodging**

## **Rehearsal Expectations & General Student Conduct**

Full group choir rehearsals will be directed by Dr. Person and Dr. Song. Comfortable clothing may be worn during rehearsals, and students should arrive promptly with music, a pencil, and personal water bottle. Students are asked to remain focused on the task at hand by demonstrating their finest rehearsal etiquette. Breaks will be provided during longer rehearsal sessions to keep minds and voices well.

Please remind your students that alcohol, tobacco products (including vapes), and other illegal substances are prohibited at Stetson University. Students in possession of any of these items will be immediately sent home at their own expense, and their school may be prohibited from future participation. Also, please remind your singers that classes will be in session across campus on Friday. To help minimize disruptions, we ask that festival participants remain in the music facilities and refrain from entering other academic buildings unless specifically directed as part of the festival. Thank you for helping us be respectful of the broader Stetson community during this event.
