

PROGRAM OVERVIEW >>>

The Accelerated Bachelor's to MAcc program allows Stetson undergraduates to seamlessly transition from their bachelor's degree to a STEM-designated Master of Accountancy, saving both time and money.

This program is open to all Stetson undergraduate students, regardless of major, but is especially well-suited for those pursuing a major or minor in accounting.

During your junior and senior years, you can take up to two designated undergraduate courses at Stetson that may count toward both your undergraduate degree and up to six elective credits in the MAcc program, enabling you to use your undergraduate scholarships and aid while getting a head start on graduate coursework.

PROGRAM BENEFITS >>>

- · Dedicated graduate business program staff and MAcc faculty are there for you from the start.
- Small class sizes and passionate, supportive faculty who offer individualized attention and support.
- Weekly interactive sessions with faculty members.
- The two designated courses are treated as undergraduate courses for tuition and financial aid. Consult Financial Aid and Student Accounts for guidance regarding your financial situation.
- The MAcc program is STEM-designated.
- The MAcc curriculum is available to you online with an in-person option.
- Courses can be completed in as little as one year.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS >>>

- Stetson junior pursuing any major with a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Must have one or two general elective courses remaining:
 - o ACCT 406 (Auditing) is a required course for all accounting majors; accounting minors should take the course as an elective
 - o BLAW 407 (Business Law) should be taken as an elective
- Complete Accelerated Bachelor's to MAcc Form.
- · Submit an application for admission to Stetson's MAcc program in your last semester of undergraduate studies.

It provides the flexibility you need through both live-online faculty interaction and asynchronous coursework.

PREPARING YOU FOR SUCCESS >>>

Your Accelerated Bachelor's to MAcc program journey begins with ACCT 406 (Auditing) and/or BLAW 407 (Business Law I). ACCT 406 (Auditing) is a required course for all accounting majors; accounting minors should take the course as an elective. BLAW 407 (Business Law I) should be taken as an elective.

Undergraduate students who earn a B or better in one or both courses are eligible to waive up to six elective credits (three credits per course) in the MAcc program, reducing the ten-course program to as few as eight graduate courses.

The remaining eight or nine courses may be completed fully online in as little as one year, with the added flexibility of optional in-person instruction.

COURSES >>

Eligible Courses for Accelerated Bachelor's to MAcc program – up to 8 credits (taken during undergraduate studies)*

- ACCT 406 Auditing
- BLAW 407 Business Law I

*The courses must be taken for a grade (not pass/fail), and a minimum grade of B is required to earn graduate credit (three credits per course). Students generally take ACCT 406 is the fall of their senior year and take BLAW 407 in the fall or spring of their junior or senior year.

- ACCT 508 Governmental and Not-For-Profit Accounting
- ACCT 509 Cases in Financial Accounting and Reporting
- ACCT 516 Advanced Auditing
- ACCT 563 Advanced Accounting Theory

Analytics Requirement - 3 credits

Business Law Requirement – 3 credits (if previously taken, may satisfy with MAcc elective)

Graduate Business or MAcc Electives - 6 or 9 credits

As part of the MAcc curriculum, students are required to select four 3-credit graduate business or MAcc electives, for a total of 12 credits. Students who successfully complete ACCT 406 (Auditing) and/or BLAW 407 (Business Law I) during their undergraduate studies at Stetson are eligible to waive up to six elective credits (three credits per course) toward this requirement.
