

# MASTER OF SCIENCE IN Higher Education Administration



## PROGRAM OVERVIEW »

The Stetson University Master of Science in Higher Education Administration and Supervision prepares candidates to support, change, and enhance higher education through personal growth, intellectual development, and global citizenship. Our students accomplish this by creating opportunities for self-reflection, creativity, and self-discovery, supporting academic inquiry through best practices, developing appropriate personal, professional, and ethical standards, and advancing opportunities for social justice, diversity, inclusion, and community engagement.

Our program blends theory and practice with the technical skills needed to lead higher education institutions in the 21st Century. Program completers are prepared to enter careers in positions including enrollment, advising, student services, faculty development, human resources, instructional design, academic and student affairs, accreditation, and disability services.

This program starts in the fall, and alternates between Stetson's campus in DeLand and Gulfport. The program is offered in two courses per semester, in eight-week blocks on weeknights during the Spring and Fall Semesters for both Year 1 and 2 of the program. During Summer Semesters, students will take one course over an eight-week block, and their second class will be a 120 Hour Internship each Summer.

### Master's Program of Study

## HIGHER EDUCATION INTERNSHIPS »

Our higher education internships provide hands-on experiences at an internship site and traditional classroom-based learning environments to integrate the theory and practice of higher education administration and supervision.

Students will have the opportunity to explore potential careers in higher education and build and increase their professional networks. Students complete a research project on a Higher Education Institution and establish a topic of a capstone research project bridging theory to practice which will conclude at the end of their second internship course the following summer.
