

Tier 1 Limitations and Exceptions

What Moving Back to Tier 1 Means

- Approved, classroom-style programming is limited to 25 or fewer individuals in approved spaces only. All other in-person general meetings, events and gatherings on or off campus are limited to 10 or fewer individuals. Gathering in outdoor spaces is encouraged.
- No Stetson guests or non-Stetson visitors are allowed in the residence halls or campus apartments except for move out, which is limited to two people.
- Only essential personnel break rooms are open.
- No food at events or within office departments is allowed.
- Tabling can continue with Tier 2 guidelines.
- Student services meetings revert to virtual and individual offices are no longer allowed short in-person meetings.
- Campus visitation through Admissions returns to nine total guests per campus visit.

Important exceptions to Tier 1 (for the next three weeks)

- Residential community kitchens will remain open for cooking to one user at a time as we have been impressed with the cleaning and process being followed by our students in this regard.
- Homecoming activities that are planned for this week and are already following strict protocols will continue with safety plans in place including kites on Stetson Green, Bingo on Libby Lawn and the corn hole tournament in Rinker Field House.
- With the proper safety precautions, events including the film screening on Nov. 5, the Black Lives Matter March on Nov. 7, and Late Night Breakfast on Nov. 19 will continue: keep an eye out for marketing and information.
- The IT help desk will still take in-person meetings by appointment.
- The 14 student workers who could not work in Tier 1 and work now may remain working in person if they so choose.
